### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Statement of standalone financial results of **Tata Investment Corporation Limited** ("the Company") for the quarter and year ended 31 March 2023 ("Statement"), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (the "Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the Statement:

- a) is presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations; and
- b) gives a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable Indian Accounting Standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Company for the guarter and year ended 31 March 2023.

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under Section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 (the "Act"). 
The Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

We are responsible for the direction, supervision and performance of the audit of the financial results of such entities included in the consolidated financial statements of which we are the independent auditors. For the other entities included in the consolidated financial results, which have been audited by other auditors, such other auditors remain responsible for the direction, supervision and performance of the audits carried out by them. We remain solely responsible for our audit opinion.

Materiality is the magnitude of misstatements in the consolidated financial results that, individually or in aggregate, makes it probable that the economic decisions of a reasonably knowledgeable user of the consolidated financial results may be influenced. We consider quantitative materiality and qualitative factors in (i) planning the scope of our audit work and in evaluating the results of our work; and (ii) to evaluate the effect of any identified misstatements in the consolidated financial results.

We communicate with those charged with governance of the Holding Company of which we are the independent auditors regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

We also performed procedures in accordance with the Circular No. CIR/CFD/CMD 1/44/2019 dated 29 March 2019 issued by the SEBI under Regulation 33(8) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 as amended, to the extent applicable.

### **Other Matters**

The consolidated financial results also includes the Group's share of net profit after tax of Rs. 7.11 Crores and Rs. 35.66 Crores for the quarter and year ended 31 March 2023 respectively and other comprehensive income of Rs. (0.23) Crores for the quarter and year ended 31 March 2023 respectively and the comprehensive income of Rs. (0.68) Crores and Rs. (0.23) Crores for the quarter and year ended 31 March 2023 respectively and other comprehensive income of Rs. (0.68) Crores and Rs. These reports have been relied upon by Gokhale & Sathe (Joint Auditors) for the purpose of the audit of the Statement.

The Statement includes the consolidated financial results for the quarter ended 31 March 2023 being the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of the full financial year ended 31 March 2023 and the published unaudited year to date consolidated figures upto 31 December 2022, being the date of the end of the third quarter of the current financial year, which were subject to limited review by us, as required under the Listing Regulations.

Our Opinion on the statement is not modified in respect of the above matters.
